Prayer of Confession

Unison: O God, hear our confession, for we still dwell in darkness. We are afflicted and crushed by a sense of inadequacy. When perplexed, we despair that there may be no hope. Persecution leaves us feeling forsaken. When foe's strike us down, we assume we're destroyed. We hear that Christ resides like a treasure within us. Transform our whole being so that we live in that truth.

Assurance of Pardon

Passing of the Peace

Sermon Text: 1 Samuel 3: 1-10 (NRSV)

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread. ²At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; 3the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. ⁴Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" 5 and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. ⁶The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." 7Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. 8The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. ⁹Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place. ¹⁰Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

The Words of Invitation

This table is open to all who confess Jesus the Christ and seek to follow Christ's way. Come to this sacred table not because you must, but because you may. Come not because you are fulfilled, but because in your emptiness you stand in need of God's mercy and assurance. Come not to express an opinion, but to seek a presence and to pray for a spirit. Come to this table, then, sisters and brothers as you are. Partake and share. This table is spread for you and for me that we might again know that God has come to us, shared our common lot, and invited us to join the people of God's new age.

The Communion Prayer

Leader: Lift up your hearts,

People: We lift them up to God,

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People**: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

We thank you, Lord God almighty, that you are a God of people, that you are not ashamed to be called our God, that you know us all by name, that you hold the world in your hands. You have created us and called us in this life that we should be made one with you to be your people here on earth. Blessed are you, creator of all that is. Blessed are you for giving us space and time for living. Blessed are you for the light of our eyes and for the air that we breathe. We thank you for the whole of creation, for all the works of your hands, for all that you have done among us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Therefore, together with all the living and all who have gone before us in faith, we praise your name, O Lord our God, saying:

Holy, Holy, Lord. God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

We thank you, Lord our God, for Jesus Christ, your beloved son, whom you called and sent to serve us and give us light, to bring your kingdom to the poor, to bring redemption to captives and to be forever and for us all, the likeness and embodiment of your constant love and goodness. We thank you for this unforgettable man who has fulfilled everything that is human -our life, our death.

We thank you because he gave himself, heart and soul, to this world.

We remember that on the night of betrayal and desertion, Jesus took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread, and gave it to the disciples saying, "This is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, Jesus took the cup, after supper saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Communion Prayer Cont.

By eating this bread and drinking this cup, we proclaim Christ's death, celebrate Christ's resurrection, and await Christ's coming again and we say what we believe:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Gracious God, we ask you to bless this bread and cup and all of us with the outpouring of your Holy Spirit. Through this meal, make us the body of Christ, the church, your servant people, that we may be the salt, and light, and Leven for the furtherance of your will in all the world.

The Words of Distribution

Through the broken bread we participate in the body of Christ. Through the cup of blessing, we participate in the new life Christ gives.

The Prayer of Thanksgiving

Eternal God, you have called your people from east and west, north and south to feast at the table of Jesus Christ. We thank you for Christ's presence and for the spiritual food of Christ's body and blood. By the power of your Holy Spirit, keep us faithful to your will. Go with us to the streets, to our homes, and to our places of labor and leisure that whether we are gathered or scattered, we may be the servant church of the servant Christ, in whose name we rejoice to pray. Amen
