### **Prayer of Confession**

Voice A: Divine Creator, we come before you with humble hearts, acknowledging

our shortcomings and seeking forgiveness.

All: We confess, O God, that we have subjected others to the kind of

rejection and misunderstanding that you yourself experienced in

the form of Jesus.

We try to control the paths of those we love, deeming them unworthy of Voice B: acceptance when they veer from our expectations for how they "should"

be or whom they "should" love.

Meanwhile, in moments of doubt, we have sometimes sought approval Voice C:

from those who do not understand our truth instead of finding solace in

the chosen family you have blessed us with.

Have mercy on us, O God, when we have believed what others say All:

## Assurance of Pardon

We Are Called (vs. 2 & 3) \*Hymn:

Scripture: Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18(NRSVUE)

<sup>1</sup>O LORD, you have searched me and known me. <sup>2</sup> You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away. <sup>3</sup> You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways. 4 Even before a word is on my tongue, O LORD, you know it completely. <sup>5</sup> You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me. <sup>6</sup> Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it. <sup>13</sup> For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. <sup>14</sup> I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well. <sup>15</sup> My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth. <sup>16</sup> Your eyes beheld my unformed substance. In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as vet existed. <sup>17</sup> How weighty to me are your thoughts. O God! How vast is the sum of them! 18 I try to count them—they are more than the sand; I come to the end—I am still with you.

Passing of the Peace

Children's Message

1 Corinthians 12:12-27(NRSVUE) Scripture:

<sup>12</sup> For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. <sup>13</sup> For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. <sup>14</sup> Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. <sup>15</sup> If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. <sup>16</sup> And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. <sup>17</sup> If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? <sup>18</sup> But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. <sup>19</sup> If all were a single member, where would the body be? <sup>20</sup> As it is, there are many members yet one body. <sup>21</sup> The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the

feet, "I have no need of you." <sup>22</sup> On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, <sup>23</sup> and those members of the body that we think less honorable we clothe with greater honor, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect, <sup>24</sup> whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, <sup>25</sup> that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. <sup>26</sup> If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. <sup>27</sup> Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.
